Guided by CERT's motto, "Be the help until help arrives", our program equips individuals to support friends, family, neighbors, coworkers, and the broader community until first responders reach the scene and to assist during large incidents when emergency services may be overwhelmed.

Although the training focuses on disaster readiness and coordinated team response, the skills taught are valuable in everyday situations as well, from rolling up on a car accident to assisting during a medical emergency or other unexpected incidents.
